News: This year, seven HOPE school graduate students passed state level School Board Exams (Class 10). Five of them passed with Grade “A” and two with Grade “B+” . The day after Bikash Chaudhary and Aayush Adhikari visited HOPE school both receiving Grade “A” in their examination. They distributed sweets and encouraged the present pupils. They are sincerely grateful to HOPE school of Kathmandu.

Story of Bikash Adhikari:

Among the passed-out students is Bikash Chaudhary. His five-member family migrated from the remote and underdeveloped district of Udayapur. It was not possible for them to earn a living there. Since then, his father Bhabi Chaudhary has been working as a plumber in Kathmandu. Bhabi is a very hard-working man, but his work does not provide him enough earnings to support his family properly. His mother stitches clothes to meet their family’s basic needs. He would have never been able to save enough money to pay school fees for his children.

However, Bikash was admitted to the HOPE school and received free education. He was a hardworking student, which is why the HOPE management made every effort to find him a scholarship at another school so he could continue his study.

Bikash proved his mettle by passing state level schooling exams. He passed with Grade “A”. He now has joined CTEVT to become an engineer with a good scholarship. Bikash and his parents are grateful to HOPE *worldwide* Nepal.

Good News From Vocational Training Centre, Chhaimale



Computer literacy is crucial for students in the modern world. Knowledge of word processing, spreadsheets and presentation software creates many opportunities for a student.

However the school computer labs in rural regions of Chhaimale often face a severe shortage of necessary equipment, meaning their pupils' IT skills fall far behind those of their urban-based peers.

Shree Krishna is a secondary school in Chhaimale, some 30 km from the capital city Kathmandu. Sparse computing resources once hampered the school's computer lessons. They struggled to catch up with their lessons, and many failed their state level examination. To solve this problem, HOPE *worldwide* Nepal has built a modern computer laboratory at the Vocational Training Center (VTC).

For the first time all the students of Shree Krishan Secondary School passed their computer subject at the State Level Examination. This year we had 100 beneficiaries from the Vocational Training Center (VTC), Chhaimale.

Distribution of Food



Sumita, mother of two lives in a single room in a tin house in Kathmandu. A slight breeze passes through an open curtainless window, making the heat bearable. A small threadbare carpet covers part of the floor, a 6-meter square space. One of her children studies in Asha Vidhyashram School.

Her husband is a daily labourer, struggling to make ends meet. Sometimes there is work and sometimes not. “If my husband works and gets the job done, he will receive only \$5 USD per day,” says Sumita, “otherwise he will come back home with empty hands. I am not able to work as my small daughter needs someone to take care of her.” Many times it is very difficult for them to provide a single meal for the children.

To provide children with nutritious food and prevent them suffering from malnutrition and chronic illness, HOPE *worldwide* Nepal provided beans, rice, oil, sugar and other food supplies (basic foods). She is very grateful that she and her husband now have enough to provide their children with a decent meal each day.
