The main objective of our organization is to empower disadvantaged & poor children through free education till primary level and Adults in our society through different vocational trainings.

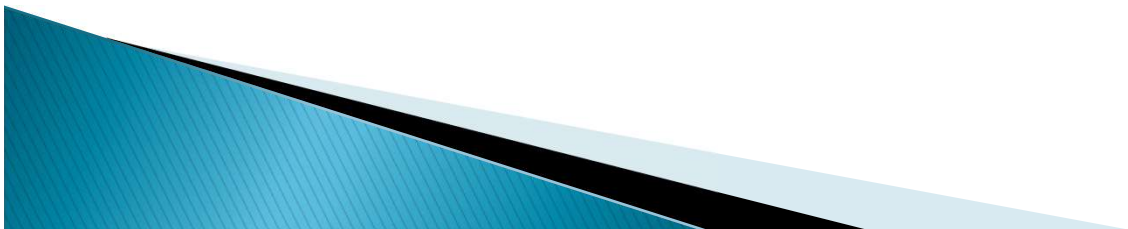

# Story of Sangit Magar



Sangit Magar is a twelve year old boy. He studies in class five. He also has a sister who is 16 years old. His three family members share a single room. His family is from Nalang village of Kavre district. His parents got married in the village. Due to hardship there, they moved to Kathmandu for the sake of the family. His father and mother work as construction labourers. Sangit's parents cannot meet all the needs of his family, facing challenges every day, and hardly able to afford to send Sangit to school.

When they heard of the HOPE school, they quickly approached us and Sangit was admitted. He enjoys school and believes that it has given him the full opportunity to get a good education. He has always ranked 1 in all the exams he has taken.

He wants to become a scientist. We pray that one day his dream may be fulfilled.

For the very first time the children from Grades 2 & 3 had an opportunity to pay a visit to the Aviation Museum. Since that time plans have been formulated to help with ongoing development in the village. These plans include: a training centre and a small factory to process the fruit that is grown in the area and add value to the crop. Foundation work started at the beginning of February and the new building should be complete by June of this year.
