
## Introduction of HOPE *worldwide* Nepal

The main objective of our organization is to empower disadvantaged & poor children through free education till primary level and Adults in our society through different vocational trainings.



#### Story of Sanjay Tamang






Sanjay is a 12 year old student from Balaju height. He has three sisters. His family migrated from their village to Kathmandu with hopes of making their life financially better. Sanjay's father worked as a labourers in Kathmandu and earned Rs.500 – 800 a day which was barely enough for him to put food on the table for his family.

A few months ago his father Ram was told that he had a heart problem which could not be operated on and he

had to stop working. As a result his mother and his elder sister both had to work as labourers to earn their daily bread.

Even though things are quite challenging for a boy of his age, Sanjay is very determined not to drop out of school but to make the most out of his situation. Sanjay is doing great in his studies. He wants to become an engineer.

We wish the best for him and his family.





November 21<sup>st</sup> to December 1<sup>st</sup>, the students of the HOPE school completed their second term exams. All of the students attended the exams and on December 10<sup>th</sup> the students were able to receive their results. Parents and family members came to the school to collect the results and speak with their children's teachers. Overall the students performed well. This exam helps the teachers gauge how their students are learning after one third of the school year has been completed, identify areas that students need to grow in, and determine where to focus their teaching as the school year continues.



#### HOPE Youth Corps (HYC) 2017 in Kathmandu, NEPAL



HYC volunteers worked hard serving in the school for more than a week. They repainted all our classrooms, renovated floors, plastered walls which were cracked and repaired the broken drainage system of our school. They painted all the school benches in different colours. They sealed all the ceilings of the library, kitchen, and store room in order to stop rats from entering the rooms at night. They donated books and toys for the school and bought us a Table Tennis board.









These volunteers brought along with them chocolates, gifts and clothes, which all the children were very happy and delighted to receive. Thank you to all the volunteers who decided to give the children a reason to smile and enjoy their week. It was a wonderful treat for the students, which they will cherish, since most of their parents struggle to feed them basic meals. What is normal for many children is "extra ordinary" for these children.

#### HOPE Youth Corps (HYC) 2017 in Kathmandu, NEPAL



HYC Volunteers taught the children to speak English, sing songs and play music. They painted our Vocational Training Centre (VTC) and gave us an excellent computer repair service to all our computers, donating some of the laptops as well. A few of them taught computer programming at the VTC.



They also visited a child's home. The narrow pathways between the houses were extremely dusty and steep, many covered in rubble. Volunteers also provided some food for their family.

We had a very special Christmas day. The children were very grateful and excited to get presents and chocolates. We had a wonderful meal cooked on

the day and the children were surprised to see Santa and were very happy and delighted to celebrate Christmas.

#### HOPE worldwide village Project



The HOPE *worldwide* village Project is focusing on a village outside of Kathmandu which has been badly affected by the earthquake of 2015. This project will greatly improve the livelihoods of vulnerable households, the economic status of farmers and better the nutritional status of children in Chaimale village. Farmers and their families will be trained on product development from their locally produced fruits, vegetation and small business development to selling these products in the market. It is our goal and desire to give extra tuition classes in English language and computer training to the local students.
